104F: Writing in the Health Sciences and Professions and the Need for Library Instruction

- 104F is one of the most frequently taken upper-division writing courses in UWP
- Serves a large constellation of H.S. adjacent degrees: nursing, dental, animal science, PT, pre-med, etc.
- Students are generally good writers and communicators, but struggle with secondary research, analysis, and synthesis
- Central project is a Review of Literature, including a detailed methods section; followed by a collaborative document that translates the review into a public-facing genre.
- This is why research instruction in this course is so essential!







The Pedagogical Purpose of Library Research Instruction from the Instructor's Perspective

- Student Learning Outcomes and Takeaways:
 - 1. Modeling and Implementing Fundamental Research Strategies
 - 2. Knowledge and Active Use of Best Resources and Databases Available through the UC Library
 - 3. Engagement in early critical appraisal; and incorporating inclusion and exclusion criteria
 - Also, introduces students to another important contact for the research and writing process: Erik Fausak and the other research librarians
 - If time, introduce and model the importance of keeping a systematic paper trail; i.e., citation management systems
 - In general, good use of active learning; promoting student to student (StS) and student to teacher (StT) interaction.




